

Alleged Traffic Violations

Several months ago, the Attorney General of Indiana has sounded an alarm that scammers of his state (but this could also be happening soon in Tennessee) are trying to steal personal and financial information from unsuspecting individuals by threatening actions related to alleged traffic violations. Scam messages claim that by a certain date, individuals will face the following actions if payment is not completed:

- They will be reported the Motor Vehicles.
- Their vehicle registration will be suspended.
- Their driving privileges will be suspended for 30 days.
- They may face prosecution and will suffer potential impacts to credit scores.

You are reminded to stay vigilant and take precautions:

- **Do Not** click on any links in unsolicited email or text messages claiming to be from the motor vehicle department.
- **Do Not** provide personal information, such as your driver's license number or Social Security number.
- **Do Not** share any card or account information through text messages or unverified links.
- **Report** the unwanted text messages as junk on the app you use and block the phone number or email address.
